Financials

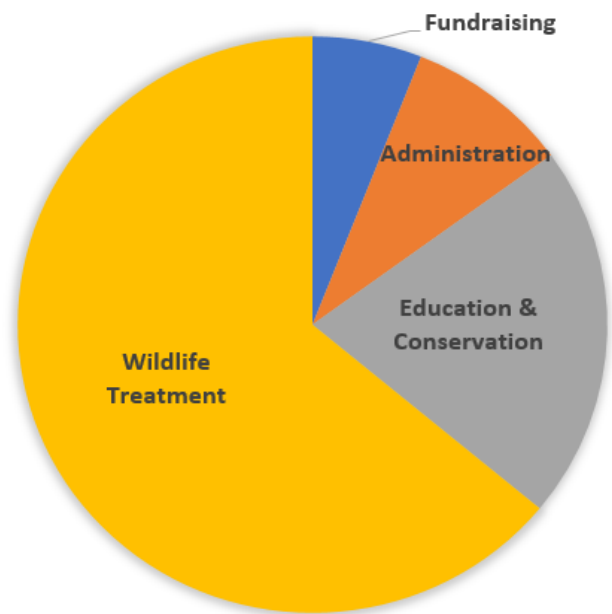
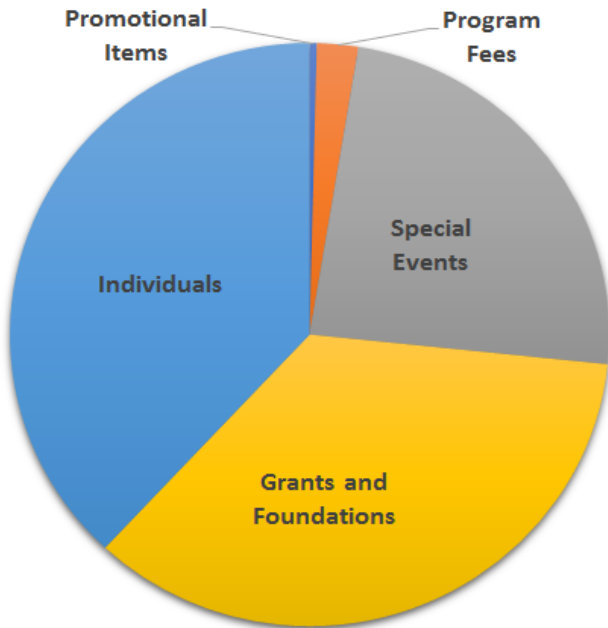
The Pelican Harbor Seabird Station is a 501 C(3) non-profit. We strive to keep our fundraising and administrative costs to a minimum, so that we can stretch our dollars and provide the best care possible. Roughly one third of our revenue comes from foundations, with the remaining balance from individual donors. Below is a snapshot of our revenue and expenditures for 2016:
